

why south africa?

To date, South Africa has 9 co-production treaties with Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, New Zealand and the United Kingdom. Germany has been the leading co-producing partner. Brazil soon will have a treaty ratified.

The Department of Trade and Industry pays back a portion of the Qualifying South African Production Expenditure (QSAPE). Foreign movie-makers subject to qualification can get from 20 - 25% of their South African costs back and local filmmakers can get from 35% - 50% back. There is also a separate postproduction incentive of 22 - 25%. Tax incentives can also be attracted
