It is important to note that you can only pay in Rands in South Africa. Money can be exchanged at the airport, commercial banks, Rennies Travel and American Express. These can be found in most shopping centres in the Western Cape. You may also find exchange facilities in some hotels.

Banking hours are: 09h00 - 15h30 (weekdays) and 08h30 - 11h00 (Saturdays) and are closed on Sundays and Public Holidays.

All major credit cards are accepted at most establishments in the Western Cape.

#### DUTY FREE SHOPPING

All stores must charge the Value Added Tax (VAT) of 15% that is levied on the purchase of most goods in South Africa. As a foreign visitor you may apply for a refund of the VAT you pay while in the country provided you apply before you depart. Ensure that you receive your tax receipts for all purchases made, to claim your VAT refund, present all your tax receipts to the VAT administrator at your point of departure.

#### **BUSINESS HOURS**

Stores at major malls including V&A Waterfront and Canal Walk are open until 9pm every day, while the stores in shopping centres close at 19h00. Informal traders and flea markets generally trade from 09h00 to 16h00. Muslim-owned businesses are closed between 12h00 – 14h00 on Fridays for Prayer Time.

#### PUBLIC SAFETY TIPS

Avoid walking in deserted and dark places at night. Never allow strangers to assist you in any way at ATMs. At night, park in a secure and well-lit area with guards. Keep photocopies and all valuable documents in a safe place.


#### **CAPE WINELANDS**

The Western Cape is a place known for its abundance of quality wine and the Cape, in particular, is intrinsically tied to the vine. Nowhere is this truer than in the Cape Winelands, a region overflowing with award-winning vintages and home to a number of world-class vineyards.

Towns such as Stellenbosch, Franschhoek, Paarl, Wellington and Robertson are now iconic in terms of the wine they produce and together they produce wine that is as diverse as it is bountiful. Set aside plenty of time if you visit the Cape Winelands, because you will never cover it in a day.

But while the wine put the Cape Winelands on the map, it delivers plenty on the food front as well, with world-class restaurants in abundance - with Franschhoek and Stellenbosch, in particular, leading the way. Both towns are home to several award-winning restaurants, ranging from fine dining to more relaxed experiences.

And you can add craft beer and whisky to the menu now, with the region quickly becoming a leader in both, ensuring that it continues to expand on what it has to offer.

#### **CAPE KAROO**

Known for its wide-open spaces, the Cape Karoo is where you want to go when the pace of city life is something you want to escape. This is where you go to get off the grid. A place of incredible beauty, wild game, clear skies and magical sunsets, the Cape Karoo has a number of nature reserves and game farms, boasting an abundance of wildlife. The Karoo National Park, for example, is home to black rhino, lions, and other wild game.



Another animal in abundance in the Karoo is sheep, who roam 'freely' around the area on large plots of land, sampling a wide range of indigenous, aromatic plants. As a result, the Cape Karoo has become famous for its succulent and tasty lamb dishes. You need to sample some when in the area!

Perhaps the best way to see this ancient land is by train, with the luxurious Rovos Rail running through the area, as well as the more affordable Blue Train and Shosholoza Meyl trains. What better way to see this magical place than by train?

While in the area, be sure to visit Matjiesfontein, a tiny 19th Century town, seemingly untouched by time, and was once considered the jewel of the Western Cape.

#### **CAPE OVERBERG**

Lying between the Cape Peninsula and the Garden Route, the Cape Overberg is known as the 'breadbasket' of the Cape, because of its wheat fields and large harvest of fruits.

This is a place that boasts great diversity with coastal towns such as Hermanus, known as the jewel of the Cape Whale Coast for its abundance of marine wildlife, the beautiful Elgin Valley, an under-appreciated wine region and Swellendam, a jaw-droppingly beautiful natural wonderland, combing to create a region unlike any other. With a landscape dominated by gentle, undulating hills, enclosed by the ocean and foreboding mountain ranges, the Cape Overberg is a favourite getaway for those seeking outdoor pursuits and adventure.

The region also boasts an abundance of animal life – both land and ocean dwelling – with the wild horses that roam the wetlands between Bot River and Kleinmond having been there for as long as people can remember and Hermanus a favourite breeding ground for the Southern Right whale. Visit the coastal town of Hermanus from May to October annually and you're virtually guaranteed a sighting of these magnificent ocean animals. The Agulhas Wine Triangle, meanwhile, is made up of the southernmost vineyards on the African continent, while the region also boasts fantastic seafood, artisanal cheeses, and much more for which to pair it with.





#### CAPE WEST COAST

The Cape West Coast (locally referred to as Weskus) is a place so awe-inspiring, so jaw-droppingly beautiful, and so magical, you would need weeks to take it all in. Stretching from Malmesbury, just outside of Cape Town, to the border of the Northern Cape at Touws River, the Cape West Coast is best known for its beautiful beaches and the quaint, seaside towns that populate the region.

Towns such as Langebaan, Lambert's Bay, Paternoster and Saldanha have all become a home-away-from-home for many Western Cape locals and are havens for those looking to escape the city. The region is also famous for its bountiful seafood, with snoek, mussels and crayfish in abundance and understandably the area has become a mecca for restaurants specializing in seafood dishes, the ingredients of which are usually fresh form the ocean in which they line.

But the Cape West Coast is not just about the sea and all things related to it! There are many wonders that lie inland with the aptly named town of Darling famous for its wildflowers, which are in full bloom over September annually, and its locally produced wines, while the Cederberg Mountains boast century-old rock art, warm, welcoming locals and some of the best hiking, mountain biking and bouldering in the world.

## GARDEN ROUTE & KLEIN KAROO

One of the most beautiful, diverse and awe-inspiring regions in the country, the Garden Route and Klein Karoo is also one of the most-loved road trips to embark on. Stretching from Witsand to Plettenberg Bay, right around to Oudtshoorn as well as Calitzdorp and Ladismith on the world-renowned Route 62, this is a place where adventure lies around every corner.

With everything from majestic mountains – and equally impressive mountain passes – to brilliantly blue coastlines and thick forested areas, the region is a natural wonderland to explore with a hugely diverse number of experiences. Route 62 runs through some fantastic small towns, with a number of options available to you – from olive and fruit farms, lesser-known but equally impressive wineries, and nature reserves.

And while the Garden Route is often celebrated for its exquisite coastal beauty, brilliant beaches and marvellous lagoons, it is also a golfer's paradise with a number of world-class courses on offer, including Fancourt in George and Pinnacle Point in Mossel Bay, with many designed by world famous golfers.

For the adventurous, there are few better playgrounds to explore, with a myriad of trails, running through indigenous forests and up epic, jaw-dropping passes, while for those who prefer the water are sure to be spoilt by what is on offer in Knysna, Wilderness and Plettenberg Bay.

The Western Cape is a hugely diverse province, a melting pot of cultures and heritage, all of which have had an impact on our landscape. Few people, however, have left a bigger impression than former South African President Nelson Mandela, both in terms of the Western Cape and the country as a whole. 'Tata' (father) Madiba as he is affectionately known is largely considered as having been the patriarch of the 'new' South Africa. The Western Cape, of course, is where he took his last steps in his 'long walk to freedom' and you can retrace those steps when you visit us.

#### DAY 1 I CAPE TOWN

#### LONG MARCH TO FREEDOM STATUE EXHIBITION

The Long March to Freedom exhibition is a monumental procession of 100 life-size bronze statues and the largest exhibition of its kind anywhere in the world. The bronze artworks depict South African and international icons, some famous and others unknown, and tell the story of South Africa's 350-year struggle for freedom and democracy. A tour through the procession is an immersive and moving experience, connecting the visitor with the lives of the person so vividly created in bronze.

#### APARTHEID TO FREEDOM WALKING TOUR

Get introduced to the history of apartheid in Cape Town and the places related to it. Hear about the apartheid laws and the consequences they had. #### TRUTH TO POWER EXHIBITION

A new and exciting permanent exhibition celebrating key aspects of the legacy of the late Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Mpilo Tutu has entered Cape Town's cultural heritage precinct. A first of its kind on the African continent, the state-of-the-art exhibition explores the multi-faceted life of this loved and respected global icon. The exhibition is housed at the historic Old Granary building, the home of the Desmond and Leah Tutu Legacy Foundation and was curated in partnership with the Apartheid Museum.

The exhibition maps the Arch's legacy through six different themes and residents and visitors to Cape Town alike are invited to come and experience.

#### DAY 2 | V&A WATERFRONT

#### ROBBEN ISLAND MUSEUM

Madiba spent 18 years imprisoned on Robben Island, which is located just under 7km from off the coast of Bloubergstrand, Cape Town. His stay there has formed an important part of the narrative and it's the perfect place to start learning of not just his life story, but his fellow political prisoners. Be inspired by stories of former prisoners as they guide you through the prison hallways and around the island, which includes a visit to the Lime Quarry and the house of another famous political prisoner Robert Sobukwe. This three-to-five-hour excursion is a life changing experience.

#### NOBEL SQUARE

Based at the iconic V&A Waterfront, Nobel Square is where the statues of Nobel Peace Prize winners Mandela, Albert Luthuli, Archbishop Desmond Tutu and FW de Klerk stand side by side. It's a favourite photo spot for visitors and locals alike, while the ever-popular V&A Food Market is located a few feet away. After lunch, make sure you explore the Waterfront properly, which has more than 450 retail stores in the main centre and a further 150 in the Watershed market.

#### **DAY 3 I STELLENBOSCH**

#### MANDELA MEMORIAL SQUARE

The Mandela Memorial Square located at the Stellenbosch Town Hall in the Cape Winelands is home to one of the lesser-known statues of Madiba. The design consists of iron silhouettes of Mandela's face applied to two sides of a wall. The eastern side also comprises a map of the eastern part of South Africa showing the places of importance in Mandela's life. The same applies to the western side of the wall (facing the town hall). A quote from Nelson Mandela's first opening of parliament speech connects the wall with a bench on the southern side. #### DAY 4 I FRANSCHHOFK

#### DRAKENSTEIN CORRECTIONAL CENTRE

Take a scenic morning drive to historic Paarl and visit the Drakenstein Correctional Centre where Nelson Mandela spent the last 14 months of his 27 years of imprisonment in a house on the property. Here, you will find a bronze statue of Nelson Mandela at the entrance of the prison, with a raised fist, signifying the freedom of a once oppressed country.

#### DAY 5 I GENADENDAL

#### GENADENDAL MISSION MUSEUM

The oldest mission station in South Africa, Genadendal (which means 'Valley of Grace') is home to about 8000 people and the Mission Museum, a national monument with beautifully restored historic buildings, showcasing some of South Africa's most important artefacts. You'll feel like you've stepped back in time as you learn about Genadendal's inspiring history. During his term as president Nelson Mandela decided to rename the presidential official residence in Cape Town from 'Westbrook' to 'Genadendal' in honour of the oldest mission settlement in South Africa.

#### GENADENDAL HIKING TRAIL

The Genadendal Hiking Trail is a relatively tough but scenic, 2-day circular route that includes an overnight stay in a farm cottage. The route starts at the Genadendal Mission Museum, winds up the mountains, through a farm, where you stay over and then back down the next day. The trail offers interesting rock formations, natural rock pools to cool off in the hot summer months and breath-taking sweeping views of the Overberg valley. With flowers dotting your walk as you go, you may even get a chance to see a few Proteas in bloom.


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
