



MORE THAN MEETS THE EYE

Yes, the Cape region is considered one of the most attractive tourist hot spots in the world thanks to its blue flag beaches, fields of Fynbos and melting pot of cultures, but there's more to it.

We're a gateway to the rest of the continent, with Africa's market expected to grow from 1.4 billion in 2021 to 2.5 billion by 2050. Our region has also attracted 287 FDI projects, resulting in a total capital investment of US\$7.47 billion over the past decade.







WORLD-CLASS INFRASTRUCTURE

In its 2022 Budget Speech, the Western Cape Government allocated about **US\$2 billion** to be spent on

infrastructure development over the medium term, with US\$739.86 million being allocated to roads infrastructure.



Cape Town is regarded as one of the leading digital cities in Africa, boasting reliable and fast WiFi. Through the implementation of digital infrastructure, the city aims to become globally competitive.



The Western Cape's mathematics pass rate increased by 1.6 percentage points to 72.4% in 2021.



The province's four major universities attract thousands of foreign students.

International students accounted for 10% of total enrolment at the four universities in 2020.


